Structure of the Exam:

The exam is divided into three sections:

SECTION A – Reading and Analysing Texts 20 marks (recommended time : **1 hour**)

SECTION B – Comparative Analysis of Texts 20 marks (recommended time : 1 hour)

SECTION C – Analysing Argument
20 marks (recommended time : I hour)

SECTION A: Reading and Analysing Texts

Instructions for Section A:

- Section A requires students to write an analytical interpretation of a selected text in response to **one** topic (either **i**. or **ii**.) on **one** text.
- Your response should be supported by close reference to the selected text.
- If your selected text is a collection of poetry or short stories, you may write on several poems or stories, or on **at least two** in close detail.
- Indicate which text you have chosen to write on and whether you have chosen to answer i. or ii.
- Your response will be assessed according to the assessment criteria set out on page XX of this book.
- Section A is worth one-third of the total marks for this examination.

Task:

Plan and write up a response to <u>one</u> of the prompts for <u>False Claims Of Colonial</u> <u>Thieves</u> provided (approx. 650+ words)

STUDY HINT:

- Go over your revision/study notes (1 page per theme) for *False Claims Of Colonial Thieves* & your study sheet for your first SAC
- ☐ Revisit a your quote banks (no more than 10 or so words) up to 5 per theme

SECTION B: Comparative analysis of texts

Instructions for Section B:

- Section B requires students to write a comparative analysis of a selected pair of texts in response to one topic (either i. or ii.) on one pair of texts.
- Your response should analyse how the two texts present ideas and/or issues, and should be supported by close reference to both texts in the pair.
- If you choose to write on a multimodal text in Section A, you must not write on a text pair that includes a multimodal text in Section B.
- In your script book, indicate which text pair you have chosen to write on and whether you have chosen to answer i. or ii.
- Your response will be assessed according to the assessment criteria set out on page XX of this book.
- Section B is worth one-third of the total marks for the examination.

Task:

Plan and write up a response to <u>one</u> of the prompts provided (approx. 650+ words) STUDY HINT:

- Go over your revision/study notes (1 page per theme) for *The Queen* and *Ransom* & your study sheet for your last SAC
- □ Revisit a the shared comparative docs for quotes etc. (no more than 10 or so words) up to 5 per theme

SECTION C: Analysing Argument

Instructions for Section C:

- Section C requires students to write an analysis of the ways in which argument and language are used to persuade others to share a point(s) of view.
- Read the background information on this page and the material on pages XX XX, and write an analytical response to the task below.
- For the purposes of this task, the term 'language' refers to written, spoken and visual language.
- Your response will be assessed according to the assessment criteria set out on page XX of this book.
- Section C is worth one-third of the total marks for this examination.
